**Incidents of Note**

- About 7am on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> June it was discovered that a car parked on Burghlee Terrace had been vandalised by having the paintwork scratched.
- About 9am on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> June police stopped and seized a car on Clerk Street, Loanhead for having no valid insurance. A 41 year old male has been charged and a report submitted to the Procurator Fiscal.
- About 7pm on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> June police stopped and seized a car on The Loan, Loanhead, for having no valid insurance. An 18 year old male has been charged and a report submitted to the procurator fiscal.
